The following Message, delivered by the Clerk of the House of Delegates, was read:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

January 15, 1866.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We propose to your Honorable Body that a Joint Committee be appointed to proceed to the Government House and take an inventory of the furniture, and report what repairs or additions are necessary; and also what amount of money
