ROBERT E. LEE HALL, Democrat.

Mr. Hall is a native of Missouri, but since the age of twenty has resided in Baltimore. In 1884 he graduated in medicine from the College of Physicians and Surgeons, and in 1894 graduated with first honors from the Baltimore Law School, and was admitted to the bar in the same year. He has been active in every campaign for the last sixteen years, and has gained a reputation as an able and forceful speaker. He has never before held an elective office. GEORGE C. MORRISON, Democrat.

JOHN L. V. MURPHY, Democrat.
