PHILIP L. HITESHEW, Republican.

Mr. Hiteshaw is a native of Frederick, born September 11, 1840. At the beginning of the Civil War he enlisted as private in Company I, First Maryland Cavalry. In an engagement at Harper's Ferry on September 13, 1862, he was severely wounded, from the effects of which he has never recovered. He was made Captain October 29, 1864, and during Appomattox campaign commanded a squadron composed of three companies.

JAMES W. SMITH, Republican.

Mr. Smith was a member of the House in 1902. He is a farmer, and was born near Woodsboro, January, 1849, and attended the public schools of that place.

CHARLES A. ANDREW, Democrat.
