**THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND.**

The University of Maryland is located at College Park in Prince George's County, on the line of the Washington branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, eight miles from Washington and thirty-two miles from Baltimore. The grounds front on the Baltimore and Washington Boulevard. The Schools of Medicine, Pharmacy, Dentistry and Law of the University are located in Baltimore at the corner of Lombard and Greene Streets.

**Administration.**

The administration of the University is vested in the President. The University Council, composed of the President, the assistant to the President, the Director of the Agricultural Experiment Station, and the Director of the Agricultural and Home Economics Extension Service, and the Deans, acts as an advisory board to the President on all phases of University work. The faculty of each college or school constitutes a faculty council, which passes on all questions that have exclusive relationship to the unit represented.
