Which was read and referred to the Committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. Bowie presented the memorial of James W. Alnutt, Dutrow and Cornell Foard & Rogers and 22 business firms and bankers of Baltimore, praying the General Assembly not to alter or amend the charter of the Baltimore and Potomac Rail Road Company;
