Mr. Lindsay, from Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act, to incorporate the President and Commissioners of the Town of Warwick.

Mr. Clarke, from Select Committee, reported favorably a bill entitled a supplement to an Act, entitled, an Act, to incorporate the Charles street Avenue Company, passed January session, 1864;

Also, a bill entitled an Act, to amend an Act, entitled an Act, to incorporate the Charles street Avenue Company;

Which were severally read a first time.

Mr. Welch, from Select Committee, reported favorably upon the Senate bill, entitled an Act, to incorporate the Village of the Head of Sassafras, in Kent county, by the name of Sassafras;

Mr. Linthicum, from Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act, to authorize the President and Directors of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, to grant a water right to Charles F. Wenner, at or near Berlin, in Frederick county.

Mr. Parsons, from Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act, to repeal section 8 of Article 30 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "crimes and punishments," and to re-enact the same, extending the provisions of said section to Somerset county.

Mr. Williams, from Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act to change the name of George Case Peterson, to Gerge Peterson;

Which were severally read a first time.
