A bill entitled, an Act to repeal article 71 of the Code of Public General Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled, "Oysters," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal the Act of January session, 1864, chapter 282, entitled, an Act to add the following section to the 4th article of Public General Laws requiring jurors to take the oath of allegiance.

A bill entitled, an Act to limit the amount of stationery furnished to the members and officers of the General Assembly, and to provide a system of commutation.

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to pay James Hopkins & Son for cleansing and restoring portraits of some of the early Governors of Maryland.
