CITIZENSHIP, RIGHTS OF—Order adopted, that the Committee on Judicial Proceedings inquire into the propriety of exercising at the present session the power conferred by the Constitution, of restoring to the full, all persons who are by section 4, of article 1, of the Constitution of this State, and the Registry Law, passed March, 1865, deprived of the right of voting, and of holding any office of honor, profit or trust, 8.
