Annual ap-

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, shall also appoint, on or before the first day of March in every year, two persons, residents in the city of Baltimore, and in no wise connected with the Maryland penitentiary, who shall be styled agents of the Maryland penitentiary, and who shall attend to all the duties now performed by the executive committee of that institution, and to such other duties as may be required of them by law, or by the order of the board of directors; *Provided*, the same be not inconsistent with their duties as prescribed by law, or by the rules and regulations herein after established.

Book-
keeper,
chaplain,

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the board of directors shall annually appoint a book-keeper, physician, chaplain and matron, and as many superintendents, deputy-keepers, guards and other officers, as they may deem necessary for the service of the institution; and shall also regulate and determine their respective salaries and duties, as far as may not be inconsistent with the laws of the state, or the rules and regulations herein after established.

Warden's
salary

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the warden shall receive a salary of fifteen hundred dollars, and shall be allowed the occupancy of such parts of the front building as a dwelling, as are not now used for the purposes of the penitentiary, and all necessary out-houses, yards and grounds not within the walls of the prison proper; and neither the warden, nor the directors, nor any other person shall have the use of any convict servants in his or their families or otherwise, or enjoy any emolument or perquisite other than the salaries and compensation expressly provided or authorized in this act.

Prohibition.

Assistant
warden.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the said warden shall annually appoint an assistant warden, who shall receive an annual salary of seven hundred dollars, and perform the duties provided by law, or by the rules and regulations herein after established.

Agents \$2
per diem.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the agents of the Maryland penitentiary shall each receive a per diem allowance of two dollars for every day that they may attend at the prison in the discharge of their duties; but this act is not intended to require their attendance on Sunday; and the directors shall also receive two dollars each for every day they may necessarily attend in the discharge of their duties as directors or in the capacity of monthly committee, as herein after provided; but when they attend in both capacities on the same day, they shall not receive more than one day's pay.
