Mr. Maddox obtained leave to introduce a bill to relieve Capt. R. Jones from responsibility for arms obtained from the State.

Which was read and referred to committee on militia.

Mr. Grove presented a petition concerning G. W. McAtee, from certain citizens of Washington County ;
