Markland, Blake, Pentland, Morse, Harig and Mullin, to introduce a bill to add to the fourth Article of Public Local Laws the following sections : Empowering the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to construct, open, enlarge or straighten sewers within the limits of said city, and to provide the means for the payment of the same, and compensation for any damage to property-holders caused by the construction, opening, enlarging or straightening of any sewer within the limits of the city.
