

*Waste.*

Farmers shall not commit waste. 52 Henry 3, Ch. 3, S. 2.

Treble damages, and forfeiture of the place wasted given against tenants for life or years, or dower. 6 Edward 1, Ch. 5.

Writ of prohibition of waste taken away. 13 Edward 1, Ch. 14.

Judgment given in waste by default shall be executed by sheriff. 13 Edward 1, Ch. 14.

Waste may be maintained by one tenant in common against another. 13 Edward 1, Ch. 22.

May be maintained against tenant, who has granted over his estate, and takes the profits. 11 Henry 6, Ch. 5.

*Weights and measures.*

*Wife.*

*Wills.*

Nuncupative wills where the estate amounts to £30 must be attested by three witnesses, and made in testators last sickness. 29 Car. 2, Ch. 3, S. 19.

Their effect as to alteration of former wills. 29 Car. 2, Ch. 3, S. 22.

Devise of lands, fraudulent against creditors. 3 William and Mary, Ch. 14.
