

629. The constables for said city shall be entitled to demand and receive the following fees :

For serving summons on claims not exceeding ten dollars and return,	\$0 31½
For serving summons on claims exceeding ten, and not exceeding fifty dollars and return,	37½
For serving summons on claims exceeding fifty dollars, and return,	50
For serving writ of replevin,	37½
For summoning and swearing each appraiser,	20
In all cases of replevin the constable to have a commission of five per centum on the amount of the appraisement, to be charged as costs whenever the case shall be settled, which appraisement shall be first certified to be correct by the justice issuing the writ of replevin.	
For serving fi. fa. or sci. fa. and return,	33½
For serving a State warrant in all cases of trespass vi et armis, trespass quare clausum fregit, to be paid by the party applying for the same,	50

MARINERS, AND CHARITABLE MARINE SOCIETY OF BALTIMORE.

630. Whenever a mariner residing in or sailing to or from the port of Baltimore shall depart this life intestate, and leaving no relations within the fifth degree, to be reckoned by counting down from the common ancestor to the more remote, the whole surplus estate of such mariner, after paying debts, funeral expenses and costs of administration, shall devolve on and become the property of the Charitable Marine Society of Baltimore.

MARKETS.

631. The mayor and city council have power to erect and regulate markets.

632. If any person shall buy, or cause to be bought, any kind of vegetables, dead meat, poultry, butter, cheese, tallow, eggs or fish, in any of the markets of said city, or within ten miles thereof, with an intent to sell the same again in such markets or city, or within two miles thereof, he shall for the first offence forfeit the article, or the value thereof; for the second offence he shall forfeit the article and be fined four dollars, and for every other offence forfeit fifteen dollars, to be recovered in a summary
