JOSEPH A. MATTINGLY, Democrat, St. Mary's County; born in Leonardtown, January 2, 1916. Attended St. Mary's Academy; Leonard Hall; University of Maryland, A.B. 1938, LL.B., 1941. Admitted to the Maryland Bar, 1941. Served with the Navy as Lieutenant Commander, 1941-46. State's Attorney, St. Mary's County, 1950-54. Married. Member of the House of Delegates, 1946-50. Elected to the Senate in 1954.

JAMES B. MONROE, Republican, Charles County; born in Waldorf, August 10, 1908. Automobile dealer. Unmarried. Member of the House of Delegates, 1935-45. Elected to the Senate in 1946. Resigned April, 1957.

MARY L. NOCK, Democrat, Wicomico County; born in Green Hill. Attended Wicomico County public schools; graduate of Beacom Business College, Wilmington, Delaware. Housewife. Married. Member of the House of Delegates, 1946-54. Elected to the Senate in 1954.

JOHN-CLARENCE NORTH, Democrat, Talbot County; born in Tilghman, August 25, 1922. Attended Easton public schools; University of Baltimore. Member of the Maryland Bar. Served in the U. S. Navy during World War II. Member, American Bar Association; Odd Fellows; Knights of Pythias; Lions; V.F.W.; American Legion; Masons; Shriners. Married. Member of the House of Delegates 1950-54. Elected to the Senate in 1954.

EDWARD S. NORTHROP, Democrat, Montgomery County; born in Chevy Chase, June 12, 1911. Attended Montgomery County public schools; Woodberry Forest Preparatory School; George Washington University, A.B. 1936. Member of the Maryland Bar. Served in U. S. Navy, with rank of Commander, 1941-46. Member, Board of Managers, Chevy Chase Village, 1932-33; Superintendent of Public Service, Chevy Chase Village, 1933-41; Attorney, Chevy Chase Village, 1946. Married. Elected to the Senate in 1954.

LOUIS N. PHIPPS, Democrat, Anne Arundel County; born in Tracy's Landing, March 6, 1896. Attended Anne Arundel County public schools; University of Baltimore, A.B. Automobile dealer and garage owner. Served overseas with the 79th Division during World War I and with the Ordnance Department during World War II. Former Alderman and twice Mayor of the City of Annapolis. Married. Member of the Senate, 1938-42, and since 1950.

HARRY T. PHOEBUS, Republican, Somerset County; born in Oriole, February 24, 1893. Attended Oriole public schools. Automobile and real estate dealer. County Commissioner, Somerset County, 1921-25; Treasurer, Somerset County, 1925; Commissioner of Labor and Statistics, 1937. Married. Member of the House of Delegates 1917-21. Member of the Senate, 1934-37, and since 1946. Minority Leader, 1955-57.
