The Governor's Commission on Health Care Policy and Financing was created by the Governor in February 1988. The Commission is conducting a comprehensive review of the State's current health care system in order to recommend ways to ensure that all Marylanders have access to quality, cost-effective health care.

During its first year of operation, the Commission will give highest priority to determining: 1) how much public and private funding will be available to provide health care under a range of economic conditions; 2) the combination of prevention, primary and acute care, and long-term care services needed; 3) options for financing each resource and creating financial and policy incentives to achieve the desired mix of services; and 4) what

recommendations from task forces, commissions, or other groups have significant implications for health care policy and financing.
