The Council develops and monitors an educational program for each State hospital center and juvenile residential institution. The Council is within the State Department of Education for administrative and budgetary purposes only. Technical assistance and support for the Council are provided by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the State Department of Education.

The Council consists of thirteen members. Eight serve *ex officio* and five are public members appointed to five-year terms by the Governor (Code Education Article, secs. 22-201 through 22-205).

The Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board originated as an advisory board established by the State Board of Education in 1971. It was created by statute in 1991 (House Bill 733, Acts of 1991). Through the adoption of regulations, the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board sets the standards for certification of teachers and other professional personnel, and the requirements for preparation of teachers and other education personnel in each public school.

The Board's twenty-five members are appointed to three-year terms by the Governor with Senate advice and consent (Code Education Article, secs. 6-701 through 6-708).
