The Jefferson Patterson Historical Park and Museum at St. Leonard, Calvert County, opened to the public in 1984. The Park extends along two and 1/2 miles of shoreline on the Patuxent River and St. Leonard's Creek. It is located on the 512-acre Point Farm, which was deeded to the State by Mary Marvin Breckinridge Patterson in honor of her husband, Jefferson Patterson. Here scientists have found evidence of prehistoric Indian sites, 10 to 12 million-year-old invertebrate fossils, and remnants

of early European settlements. The Park and Museum will be developed over the next ten years as an educational, research and recreational facility.

The Historic St. Mary's City Commission originated in 1966 as the St. Mary's City Commission (Chapter 115, Acts of 1966). Formerly under the Department of Economic and Community Development, the Commission became part of the
