The New Community College of Baltimore was formed in 1990 as a State institution of higher education (Chapter 220, Acts of 1990).

The College offers associate degree and certificate programs in more than thirty fields, including computer information, electronics, nursing, business, allied health, legal assisting, and office technology. In addition to job training and transfer programs, the College offers extensive noncredit programs in basic literacy, G.E.D. preparation, English as a second language, as well as courses for senior citizens. The College also works to meet the needs of Baltimore employers through courses and programs at its downtown Business and Industry Center.

With a faculty of 111 full-time and over 500 part-time instructors, the College annually serves more than 8,000 students at the Liberty Heights campus, the Harbor campus, and many sites throughout Baltimore.

The College is governed by a nine-member Board of Trustees, appointed by the Governor with Senate advice and consent. Eight members serve three-year terms through June 30, 1993. A student member serves a one-year term. The Board of Trustees appoints the President of the College (Code Education Article, secs. 16-601 through 16-610).

MANDATED REPORTS

Annual Report to Governor, Senate Budget & Taxation Committee, House Appropriations Committee, & Department of Fiscal Services due Aug. 1.

Created in 1990, the Peabody Institute Oversight Committee recommends cost reductions and revenue enhancements to stabilize and improve the financial condition of Peabody Institute, the music conservatory located in Baltimore City (Chapter 267, Acts of 1990). The Committee proposes the level of State funding to be appropriated for the Institute. The Committee also recommends what amount of State funds should be disbursed to the Institute every six months.

The Committee consists of nine members. Four are appointed by the Governor. The Senate President appoints a senator and the House Speaker appoints a delegate as nonvoting members. The Lieutenant Governor chairs the Committee, and the Secretary of Budget and Fiscal Planning, and the Secretary of Higher Education serve *ex officio* (Code State Finance and Procurement Article, secs. 7-317 through 7-323).
