The Office of Justice Administration originated as the Governor's Office of Justice Assistance in 1987 (Executive Order 01.01.1987.17). The Office was reorganized under its present name in 1992 (Executive Order 01.01.1992.02).

For programs in the administration of justice, the Executive Director engages in comprehensive planning and administers and monitors funds, grants, and services authorized and appropriated under federal legislation. State and local problems in justice administration also are evaluated by the Executive Director.

The Executive Director advises the Governor on budget requests and legislation for the administration of justice. On national, State or local boards or bodies concerned with the administration of justice, the Executive Director may be designated as the

Governor's representative. Appointed by the Governor, the Executive Director also serves on the Criminal Justice Information Advisory Board and the State Board of Victim Services.

The Governor's Advisory Board for Justice Administration was formed in 1987 as the Governor's Advisory Board for Justice Assistance (Executive Order 01.01.1987.17). The Board was restructured under its current name in 1992 (Executive Order 01.01.1992.02). The Board helps the Executive Director of the Office of Justice Administration develop strategy to support the State's application for federal aid in the administration of justice. The Board reviews and makes recommendations to the Executive Director on all requests for funds, grants, and services chosen by the Office for administration or combined planning. The Board also recommends to the Governor measures to combat State and local problems in the administration of justice.

Appointed by the Governor, the Board consists of fifteen members. Seven serve ex officio. One is a senator nominated by the Senate President. One is a delegate nominated by the House Speaker. Nominated by the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals, one member represents the Circuit Court. Another member is nominated by the State's Attorneys' Association. Four members are persons who have demonstrated concern, interest, or knowledge in the area of criminal justice. The Governor designates the chairperson and vice-chairperson.

The Maryland Juvenile Justice Advisory Council was established in 1984 as an independent unit within the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (Executive Order 01.01.1984.08). In 1987, the Council was placed under the Juvenile Services Agency (Executive Order 01.01.1987.21). The Council became part of the Governor's Office in 1988 (Executive Order 01.01.1988.01). In 1992, the Council was reformed as a subcommittee of the Governor's Advisory Board for Justice Administration (Executive Order 01.01.1992.02). The Council advises the Governor and appropriate State agencies on the juvenile justice system and prevention of juvenile delinquency.
