Annual Report to Governor due Dec. 31. Three-Year Plan for service programs due May 1, 1994, with annual updates thereafter.

The Governor's Commission on Service was formed by the Governor in January 1994 (Executive Order 01.01.1994.01). The Commission oversees administration of Maryland's participation in the National and Community Trust Act of 1993. This oversight requires developing and updating a three-year strategic plan for service programs in Maryland. The plan is to set funding and program priorities for allocation of federal formula funds. With the Governor's approval, the Commission may apply to the Corporation for National Service and other public and private sources for funding. Thereafter, the Commission shall oversee implementation of the strategic plan.

By assuming the responsibilities of the Governor's Advisory Board on Service and Citizenship and the Governor's Volunteer Council, the Commission ensures coordination of all service programs in Maryland.
