The Governor's Commission on Efficiency and Economy in State Government was created by the Governor in September 1991 (Executive Order 01.01.1991.29). The Commission reviewed State programs and operations to recommend the elimination or reduction of programs which the State should no longer finance. Management practices in State agencies also were examined by the Commission in order to recommend methods that streamline decision-making and improve operational efficiency. In addition, the Commission analyzed staffing patterns of State agencies and recommended the elimination of any wasteful practices or duplicate services.

The Commission submitted to the Governor a preliminary report in December 1991, an interim report in April 1992, and a final report in January 1993. The Governor endorsed the Commission's suggestions. Recommendations requiring no statutory change were adopted by administrative action. In response to the Commission report, the General Assembly enacted fourteen bills in 1992, and six bills in 1993.

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In October 1990, the Task Force to Review and Evaluate the Delivery System of Services to the Elderly was created by the Governor. The Task Force was to recommend an organizational structure that would enable the State to meet the needs of elderly citizens. The Task Force considered the roles, responsibilities, and relationships of State and local agencies that serve the elderly; structures to ensure effective planning, budgeting, and coordinating of services at the State and local levels; and responsibilities, structure, and organizational placement of the Office on Aging within State government.

The Task Force reported to the Governor by letter of January 31, 1991.

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The Governor's Commission on Emergency Medical Services was formed in July 1992 by the Governor (Executive Order 01.01.1992.16). The Commission's charge was to recommend a governing structure for Maryland's emergency medical system and the best way to use and deliver emergency medical services. In the assignment of patients to hospitals, the Commission defined the roles of the chief executive officer of the University of Maryland Medical Systems Hospital and the director of the Maryland Institute of Emergency Medical Services Systems.

The Commission submitted its report in December 1992. Based on Commission recommendations, House Bill 1222 was enacted by the General Assembly in 1993 (Chapter 592, Acts of 1993).
