

education. The School also teaches communication skills, including speech and speech reading, signs and finger spelling, and auditory training; and the use of individual hearing aids. It offers a broad athletic and physical education program, as well as social and recreational activities. To help graduating students secure employment, vocational or technical training, or higher education, vocational rehabilitation services are available.

The Board of Trustees of the Maryland School for the Deaf governs the School. With Senate advice and consent, the Governor appoints the Board's nineteen members to six-year terms (Code Education Article, sec. 8-304).

The Domiciliary Care Facilities Board was created by the Governor at the request of the General Assembly in 1984 (Joint Resolution no. 23, Acts of 1984). In 1986, the Board was established by law (Chapter 726, Acts of 1986).

Because the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the Department of Human Resources, and the Office on Aging all license and regulate domiciliary care facilities, the Board formulates and implements policy and coordinates agency responsibility. The Board also reviews and approves policies and regulations for domiciliary care facilities and related programs. Such facilities provide domiciliary, personal or nursing care to unrelated individuals who rely on the facility for help with daily activities in a safe and healthful environment.

The Board has eight members. Five are appointed to four-year terms by the Governor. Three serve *ex officio*. The Governor names the chair (Code 1957, Art. 41, sec. 10-601).

Established in 1984, the Maryland Economic Development Corporation is a public instrumentality of the State (Chapter 498, Acts of 1984). The Corporation enables the State to develop property for economic purposes. To serve the public interest, the Corporation develops vacant or unused industrial sites and facilities and other economic resources in which the private sector has shown no significant interest or development capability.

The Corporation operates in economically distressed areas of the State. It helps State and local economic development agencies expand, modernize, and retain businesses, and attract new ones.

The Board of Directors is appointed by the Governor with Senate advice and consent. It consists of twelve members, including two *ex officio* voting members. Members serve four-year terms. With the Governor's approval, the Board appoints the Executive Director (Code 1957, Art. 83A, secs. 5-101 through 5-116).
