

So three-fifths of all the members elected not having voted in the affirmative, the House refused to pass the bill over the veto of the Governor.

The Senate bill entitled an Act repeal section 38, of Article 22, of the Code of Public Local Laws for Worcester county passed at the January session, 1868,
