Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill entitled an Act to authorize and require the Commissioners of Baltimore county to levy a sum of money for the payment to the National Union Bank of Maryland, at Baltimore, of the balance of a debt due the said bank, contracted by the Commissioners of Public Free Schools in the first election district of Baltimore county, under the Act of 1832, chapter 287.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to repeal section 7, of Article 83, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Sales and Notices," and to re-enact the same in an amended form.

Leave of absence was granted to the Senator from Calvert county, until Monday next.

Leave was granted to the Senators from Worcester, Cecil and Howard counties to introduce a bill to exempt the waters of Synapuxent bay, in Worcester county, from any tax on oyster boats, under Custom House tonnage.
