The House proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a lot of ground, in which to inter the remains of the Confederate dead at Point Lookout in St. Mary's county, whilst prisoners of war during the late civil strife, and enclose and ornament the same.

Said bill being upon a third reading,

The bill was then read a third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
