The Senate bill entitled an Act to refund to Doctor C. C. Cox, of Talbot county, a sum of money paid into the Treasury on an erroneous assessment of property.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to refund to Morzan H. Clark, of Washington county, the sum of fifty dollars, paid by him into the Treasury, on or about the 24th day of January, 1872.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to pay Banner Grans, of Washington county, the sum of twenty dollars pension due to Joseph Grans, deceased.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to refund to Frances M. Goddard, Collector First District of St. Mary's county, Charles M. Fowler, Collector of Fourth District, St. Mary's county, and Richard J. Marshall, of St. Mary's county, monies erroneously paid into the Treasury.

Also,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to provide for the payment to Samuel Snitz and Sarah A. Sook, of Washington county, of arrears of pension, lost by the accidental omission of their names from the Act passed at the January Session 1870, chapter 477.
