Mr. Stone, Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, reported unfavorably,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Governor to appoint a Commissioner to examine the fisheries of the State, with a view to their increase, improvement and protection, and to report thereon to the next General Assembly, and to introduce into the Great Gunpowder River, and other suitable waters of the State, the fish known as the black bass, and to appropriate a sum of momey to defray the expense thereof, and the report was adopted.
