REPORT.

To the House of Delegates of Maryland :

The Joint Committee on Printing report, that the Printers of the General Assembly, have delivered all Documents ordered by both Houses of the General Assembly, both in English and German, with the exception of the School Report, which, owing to the lateness of the time in which it was received, will be ready in a few days for delivery to the members of the General Assembly. They have selected and authorized Samuel T. McCullough, Esq., to index the Journal of the House of Delegates, Stevenson Archer of John, Esq., to index the Journal of the Senate, and Senate and House of Delegates Resolutions and Documents, and Thos. H. Moore, Esq., to index the laws passed by this General Assembly, at the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars each, payable by the Comptroller when the work is completed.
