We have received your message, informing us of the appointment of a Joint Committee—three on the part of the House and two on the part of the Senate—to wait on his Excellency the Governor elect, and request his attendance on Wednesday, the 10th inst., at 2 o'clock, P. M., in the Senate Chamber, to qualify according to the Constitution and form of government of the State, and respectfully non-concur therein.

We would suggest a Committee of five to inform the Governor elect officially, by written communication, of his election, and on his arrival at Annapolis, to wait upon him, in conjunction with the Committee of Arrangements of the Senate, already appointed, and escort him to the Senate.

We have appointed on the part of the Senate, Messrs. Earle and Compton.
