AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add at end of section 13, after the word "dollars," the words, "*Provided*, that in all cases where the debt or damage claimed by the plaintiff shall exceed the sum of one hundred dollars, the City Court of Baltimore City shall have concurrent jurisdiction.
