BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges of Baltimore county court, be and they are hereby authorised and directed, to extend to Edward B. Lowry, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the act of assembly passed at November session, eighteen hundred and five*, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the several supplements thereto, without requiring the said Edward B. Lowry to produce the assent, in writing, of two thirds of his creditors, as is prescribed by the provisions of the said act and supplements.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges, or any one judge, of Baltimore county court, be and they, or any one of them, are hereby authorised and directed, to extend to Benjamin Williams the benefit and relief of the act of assembly passed at November session, eighteen hundred and five†, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the supplements thereto, without compelling him to produce the assent of two thirds in amount of his creditors, and to extend and afford to the said Benjamin Williams all the benefits, advantages and provisions, of the aforesaid act, and the supplements thereto, in the same manner, and upon the same terms and conditions, as if he had obtained the assent of two thirds of his creditors to his release under the same.
