

## CHAP. 35.

Passed Jan 2, 1817

Preamble.

Dorchester divided into five election districts.

Part of constitution repealed.

## CHAP. XXXV.

*An Act to repeal all that part of the Constitution and Form of Government as relates to the division of Dorchester County into three separate Election Districts. Lib. TH. No. 5. fol. 172.*

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that great convenience would result to the voters of Dorchester county, by increasing the number of election districts in said county; therefore,

1. **BE IT ENACTED**, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Dorchester county, for the purpose of holding all future elections for delegates, electors of senate, and sheriffs of the aforesaid county, shall be divided and laid off into five separate districts.

2. **AND BE IT ENACTED**, That all that part of the constitution and form of government\* whereby Dorchester county hath been divided and laid off into three separate districts, for the purpose aforesaid, be and the same is hereby repealed.

3. **AND BE IT ENACTED**, That if this act shall be confirmed by the general assembly of Maryland, after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the constitution and form of government directs, in such case this act and the alteration herein contained, shall constitute and be considered as a part of the said constitution and form of government, to all intents and purposes, any thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

This act was confirmed by 1817, ch. 42, and the county laid off into election districts, &c. by 1816, ch. 127.

## CHAP. XXXVI.

Passed Jan 2, 1817

*An Act to alter and change the place of holding the Elections in the first Election District in Harford County. Lib. TH. No. 5, fol. 173.*

Place of holding elections in first district changed.

**BE IT ENACTED**, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges in the first election district in Harford county be, and they are hereby authorised and directed, to hold, in future, the elections in said district at and in the house of George Cunningham, in the town of Abingdon, any law, usage or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding.

## CHAP. XXXVII.

Passed Jan 3, 1817

*An Act to empower the Judges of the Fifth Election District in Washington County to hold the Elections in any suitable House in the Town of Hancock. Lib. TH. No. 5, fol. 173.*

Elections in fifth district to be held in Hancock.

**BE IT ENACTED**, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges of the fifth election district in Washington county be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to hold in future, the elections in said district, in any house in the town of Hancock, which to them may be most convenient for holding the said elections.

## CHAP. XXXVIII.

Passed Jan. 3, 1817

*An Act to locate and make public a Road connecting the Road leading from William's Ferry with Market-Street in Frederick Town, Frederick County. Lib. TH. No. 5, fol. 174.*

Commissioners appointed to lay out road.
