The act of 1807, ch. 71, to encourage the destruction of Crows, repealed as to Anne-Arundel county,	— 21
Money to be levied for the support of Robert Atwell,	— 29
So much of the act to provide for the education of poor children in certain counties, (1816, ch. 244,) as relates to Anne Arundel county, repealed,	— 49
Money to be levied for the support of Maria Hinton,	— 74
— Same for Jane Gaither,	— 75
— Same for the children of Joseph Steward,	— 101
The pay of the judges of the orphans court increased to three dollars,	— 182
The collector to collect the money heretofore levied under the act of 1816, ch. 244, for the education of poor children, &c. not yet collected, and pay the same to the treasurer of the school fund,	— 200 1
— The said treasurer directed, after paying all contracts for the education of poor children made by the trustees, to pay the remainder to the levy court,	— — — 2
