## CHAP. VI.

Passed 6th of June 1674 An act for limiting of actions against the Surveyor-General of this Province. Lib. C and WH. fol. 234. Lib. WH. fol. 106. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 81.

For 2 years, &c. Expired in 1682.

## CHAP. VII.

Ditto. An act concerning those Servants that have Bastards. Lib. C and WH. fol. 235. Lib. WH. fol. 107. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 82.

For 3 years, &c. Expired after various revivals, in 1692, when a new law was made, ch. 49.

## CHAP. VIII.

Ditto. An act for appointing Court Days in each respective County within this Province. Lib. C and WH. fol. 236. Lib. WH. fol. 121. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 83.

Confirmed by 1676, ch. 2. A new act made 1684, ch. 5.

## CHAP. IX.

Ditto. An act against Burners of Fences. Lib. C and WH. fol. 238. Lib. WH. fol. 108. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 84.

For 3 years, &c. Continued by several reviving acts. A new law 1692, ch. 40.

## CHAP. X.

Ditto. An act concerning taxable Persons. Lib. C and WH. fol. 238. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 85.

For 3 years, &c. Was repealed by 1676, ch. 2, but revived 1678, ch. 15, and expired in 1681.

## CHAP. XI.

Ditto. An act declaring what shall be done by the Sheriff *ex officio*. Lib. C and WH. fol. 239. Lib. WH. fol. 117. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 85.

By this act is repealed 1662, ch. 13. A new law 1692, ch. 28.
