RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he Half pay allowed to Wim, Dawson is hereby directed and required to pay to William Dawson, of Cecil county, late a meritorious soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a provision to him in his indigent situation, now advanced in life, and as a further remuneration to him for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

WHEREAS it appears to this general assembly, that Vachel Bur- In favour of Vagess, a captain in the late revolutionary war, did not receive the commutation in lieu of the half pay for life promised to the officers and soldiers; therefore, RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to the said Vachel Burgess, four years full pay as a captain, free from interest, as a full compensation for his services during the late revolutionary war.
