RESOLVED, That George Plummer Hinckle, of Allegany county, be and he is hereby released from the payment of fourteen dollars sixteen cents and two thirds of a cent, the valuation of certain improvements returned in a certificate of survey made for the said Hinckle, called Walnut Plains, and bearing date the seventh day of November eighteen hundred and eleven; and that the treasurer of the western shore, upon the payment of the caution money, receipt for the same in full upon the said certificate; and that patent may issue thereupon—the other rules and regulations of the land-office, in such cases, being fully complied with.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay annually, in quarterly payments, unto Thomas Rowse, late a lieutenant in the Maryland line of the revolutionary war, or to his order, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, as a further reward for those services rendered his country during the American war.
