

CHAP. 76.

Bond to be lodged
in clerk's office.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of said commissioners, before they act as such, to lodge the bond made and entered into as aforesaid in the office of the clerk of Baltimore county court, there to be recorded, and upon such bond, or any office copy thereof, suit or suits may be instituted against the obligors therein, or any of them, or their legal representatives, for any breach or non-compliance with the condition of the same.

CHAP. LXXVII.

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Calvert county be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, at their discretion, to assess and levy, in any two years, a sum of money, not exceeding one thousand dollars, for the purpose of building a clerk's office at Prince-Frederick-town, in said county, to be levied and collected as other county charges.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the levy court of Calvert county have full power and authority to contract for the building and completing the said office.

CHAP. LXXVIII.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Patten Coleman, of Baltimore county, by his petition to this general assembly hath set forth, that he is now upwards of sixty-five years of age, and has served six years in the revolutionary war, and having received a wound in the thigh, which occasions him to halt in that member; that he is afflicted with the palsy, which renders him incapable of maintaining himself, and praying that a law may pass authorising the levy court of Baltimore county to levy a sum of money on the assessable property of said county for his support; and the same appearing reasonable, therefore,

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Baltimore county shall be and are hereby directed and empowered, at their levy courts annually, so long as they may see cause, to assess and levy on said county a sum of money, not exceeding thirty dollars, for the support and maintenance of the said Patten Coleman, and that the same be collected and paid annually to the aforesaid Patten Coleman by the collector of Baltimore county, agreeable to the order of the levy court aforesaid.
