CHAP. 102.

CHAP. CII.

Passed Jan 27 1806

An Act authorising a Lottery for raising a sum of money for repairing St. George's Church, on Deer Creek, in Harford County. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 159.

Supplementary acts 1807, ch. 118, and November 1809, ch. 57.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of Robert Morgan, one of the members of St. George's church, on Deer creek, in Harford county, that the said church is very much out of repair, and praying that an act may pass authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for repairing the same;

Scheme may be proposed.

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Parker Hall Lee, Abraham Jarrett, Zacheus O. Bond, Isaac Perryman, Edward Prigg, Thomas S. Chew, William Wilson, of Wm. John Ayres and John Hopkins, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorised to propose a scheme of lottery, and to sell and dispose of tickets therein, for raising a sum of money not exceeding three thousand dollars, for repairing the said church.

Bond to be given

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That before the said Parker Hall Lee, Abraham Jarrett, Zacheus O. Bond, Isaac Perryman, Edward Prigg, Thomas S. Chew, William Wilson, of Wm. John Ayres and John Hopkins, proceed to make sale of any ticket or tickets in the said lottery, they shall give and execute a bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty of six thousand dollars, conditioned that they will well and truly conduct the drawing of said lottery, and apply the money arising therefrom, within six months after the drawing thereof, to the payment of the prizes drawn therein to the adventurers to whom they shall be due, and the necessary expenses incurred in the management thereof, and the residue to the repairing of said building.

to be lodged in clerk's office.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said bond shall be lodged in the office of the clerk of Harford county, to be there recorded, and upon such bond, or any office copy, suit or suits may be instituted for any breach or non-compliance with the condition thereof.

CHAP. CIII.

Passed Jan 27 1806

An Act to pay the Civil List, and other expenses of Civil Government. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 160.

Preamble.

WHEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities and labour, to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services;

Officers salaries.

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following officers of civil government for the time being shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries, in current money, for the ensuing year, to wit: The treasurer of the western shore, two thousand dollars; the treasurer of the eastern shore, four hundred and fifty dollars; the auditor, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the council, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the senate, one hundred and fifty dollars; the clerk of the house of delegates, three hundred dollars; the printer to the state, twelve hundred dollars; the messenger to the council, two hundred and fifty dollars.

Unappropriated monies to be first applied to payment thereof.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all monies which shall remain in the treasury, after discharging the journal of accounts, and all unappropriated money which may come into the treasury, be first applied to the payment of the civil list for the ensuing year.
