

5. AND BE IT ENACTED, That immediately after the said Baltimore Female Academy shall vest in, and become the property of, the said mayor and city council as aforesaid, or so soon thereafter as may be, the said mayor and city council shall and may proceed to appoint and employ suitable and proper persons for the education and instruction of females in the same, and may from time to time make and pass such ordinances, rules and regulations, for the well being and government of the said academy, as they may deem just and proper, provided the same be not in anywise contrary to the laws of this state, or the laws of the United States.

CHAP. 71.

When it shall be so vested they may appoint proper persons for the instruction of females thereon.

A Supplement, ch. 150.

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for Ebenezer Finley, Charles Bohne, William Cribs, Michael Kimmel, John Stouffer, Daniel Lammot, Asahael Hussey and David Harris(a), or a majority of them, to propose a scheme or schemes of a lottery, to raise a sum of money, not exceeding twelve thousand dollars(a), clear of all expenses incurred in drawing the said lottery, and to sell and dispose of the tickets thereof, and to draw the same; provided that the said Ebenezer Finley, Charles Bohne, William Cribs, Michael Kimmel, John Stouffer, Daniel Lammot, Asahael Hussey and David Harris, or a majority of them that undertake to act under this law, before the sale or disposal of any ticket or tickets in said lottery, give their bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars, conditioned that they will well and truly apply so much money arising therefrom, within six months after the drawing the said lottery be completed, as will satisfy the fortunate adventurers for prizes drawn by them, and shall, within twelve months after the drawing of the said lottery is completed, apply the money raised by such lottery for the purpose of purchasing a fire engine, and building a house, with an alarm bell thereon, in the western precincts of Baltimore.

Scheme may be proposed.

(a) By ch. 150, other managers added, and the sum to be raised increased.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of the said managers, before they act as such, to lodge the bond entered into as aforesaid in the office of the clerk of Baltimore county court, there to be recorded, and upon such bond, or any office copy thereof, suit or suits may be instituted against the obligors therein, or any of them, or their legal representatives, for any breach or noncompliance with the conditions of the same.

Managers to give bond.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said managers be, and they, or any person or persons appointed by them, are hereby authorised, to dispose of and sell all or any of the tickets of said lottery in the city of Baltimore, or any part of this state, exclusive of any control over the same by the corporation of the city of Baltimore, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Authorised to sell tickets in any part of the state.
