That whereas your petitioner is Convenient to keepe an Ordinary Convenient for [those] that doth Resort to this towne etc.

Wherefore your humble petitioner doth humbly pray that he may have a Lyce[nce from] this worshipfull Court that hee may bee Admitted to keepe an ordinary and youre [said] Petitioner as in Duty bound Shall Ever pray.

Whereupon the Court haveing no more presentments to Send to the Said Inquest did Discha[rge] the Said Inquest Allowing them two hundred lbs. of tobacco att Charles Tracys.
