Nicholson, with a written Credential under the Hand & Seal of the Electors, (see Proceedings of Electors 1840 p.p. 84.85.) to be by him conveyed with all convenient dispatch, before the first Wednesday in January next ensuing, to the President of the Senate of the United States at Washington. In the event there should be no President of the Senate, as aforesaid, to be by him deposited in the Department of State at Washington.

On motion of Mr. Wickes, it was resolved unanimously by the Electors (putting the question) that the thanks of the Electoral College are tendered to the President thereof for his able & dignified administration of the duties of the Chair.

On motion of Mr. Wickes, it was resolved unanimously that the thanks of the Electoral College are due to the Secretary for the skilful & efficient performance of his important duties.

Whereupon, the Electors adjourned.
