Wednesday, the 5th. Day of December 1792.

At a meeting of the Electors for the State of Maryland of the President and Vice President of the United States of America were assembled the following Gentlemen duly returned to the Election of Maryland, Electors, as aforesaid:

For the Western Shire:

John Lacy Howard,  
 Thomas Sim Lee,  
 Richard Potts Lequire.

For the Eastern Shire:

Williams Richardson,  
 Donaldson Yates,  
 John Toney,  
 Levin Windsor Lequire.

William Smith and Samuel Hughes Lequire, also elected for the Western Shire, not attending, the Board of Electors proceeded to give their votes, agreeably to the Constitution and Laws, in such cases provided.

We the Subscribers, Electors, as aforesaid, do then fervently certify that having met, as aforesaid; and having each voted, by ballot, for two persons, agreeably to the Constitution of the United States; and having examined the ballots; it appeared that

George Washington,  
 of Virginia, now President of the United States, had Eight votes.  
 And that

John Adams,  
 of the State of Massachusetts, now Vice President of the United States, had Sixteen votes.

We further certify that we have appointed Mr. Eli Balliett, of the City of Annapolis, to take charge of, and deliver one of our certificates, as the Law requires, and that the said Mr. Balliett hath accepted the appointment.
