The President was directed to deliver one copy of said Certificate to Mr. Jesse Cookman Boyd one of the Electors to be by him deposited in the Post Office in the City of Annapolis addressed to the President of the Senate of the United States at the Seat of Government Washington D. C. and one of the said Certificates to Mr. Adam C. King (another of the Electors) to be by him conveyed and delivered to the Judge of the District Court of the United States for the District of Maryland.

The remaining Certificate was given to a special messenger to be by him conveyed and delivered to the President of the Senate of the United States at Washington D. C.

Mr. Emanuel W. Herman was selected as such messenger.

Mr. Secretary of the College was selected as such messenger.
