

SEC. 14. *And be it enacted*, That the County Commissioners of Allegany County be and they are hereby authorized and directed to use for an almshouse the buildings formerly used for the Allegany County Insane Asylum, known as "Sylvan Retreat;" said County Commissioners are also hereby authorized, if deemed necessary, to employ one or more attendants to assist in taking care of any insane person who may be removed from the county insane asylum to said almshouse.

To use insane asylum as a county almshouse.

SEC. 15. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 506.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 334 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1890, entitled "An Act to regulate the sale and the granting of licenses for the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors in Baltimore County, as amended by Chapter 436 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1896," and to repeal said last mentioned Act.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Chapter 334 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1890, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section, to be designated as Section 4A, and to follow Section 4, to read as follows:

Regulating sale of liquors

4A. That the signature of any person who shall sign the certificate annexed to the application for any one who should apply for a license to sell spirituous or fermented liquors in said county under the provisions of said chapter shall not be considered in making up the names of persons necessary to secure such a license, if such person shall sign such certificate for more than one application for such a license.

Signatures on application for license.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to dealers who sell quantities of not less than a pint and not to be consumed on the premises.

Does not apply to certain dealers.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That Chapter 436 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1896, amendatory of Chapter 334 of the Acts of 1890, be and the same is hereby repealed.
