The bill entitled an Act to prevent the catching and destruction of fish in the waters of the Pocomoke River and Sound, below the village of Shelltown, in Somerset county.

The bill entitled an Act to add a new section to Article 1, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Allegany County," sub-title "Sheriff."

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize George Little, Thomas Little and Thomas V. Hunter, surviving Trustees of the Wiseburg Church, to sell and convey certain real estate.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 4 of an Act passed at January session, 1870, chapter 400, entitled an Act to authorize the Frederick and Pennsylvania Line Rail Road Company to build a Railroad from Frederick city, the terminus of the road, which it is authorized under its charter to build through Frederick and Montgomery counties, to the boundary of the District of Columbia, so as to make a direct connection with the City of Washington, and to reenact the same with amendments.

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Seneca Point Club of Cecil county, Maryland, to elect non-resident Directors.
