

of said county, to receive a deed conveying to said School Commissioners and their successors in office, all the right, title and interest of the said Archbishop of Baltimore and his successors, in and to the said lot of land; said deed to be duly acknowledged and recorded according to law.

SEC. 1. *And be it enacted,* That said lot, when so conveyed, shall be held and used by said School Commissioners and their successors in office, as and for a public school-house, subject to the laws now in force, or which may be hereafter enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. Hold and use.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 115.

AN ACT to prevent the killing or trapping of grouse in Kent county, until the twentieth day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight.

SEC. 1. *Be it enacted,* That it shall not be lawful to shoot or trap grouse in Kent county, until after the twentieth day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight. Not lawful to trap or shoot.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That any person or persons guilty of violating the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, before some justice of the peace of the said county, shall pay a fine of ten dollars; one-half of which shall go to the informer and the other half into the school fund of said county, and in default of the payment of said fine, shall be confined in the county jail for a term, not less than five nor more than twenty days.
