Leave was granted to Messrs. Walsh, Longwell and Lloyd to introduce a bill to amend section 37, Article XII. of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Harford county," sub-title "Elections."

Mr. Lloyd submitted the following message :

BY THE SENATE,

February 26th, 1874.

Groome, the Governor elect, and inform him of his election and request his attendance on Wednesday, the 4th of March next, at 12 o'clock, M., in the Senate Chamber to qualify according to the Constitution and form of Government of this State.
