

James Stewart shall not be authorised to have or claim any right, title or interest in, the estate, real, personal or mixed of the said Henrietta T. Stewart, whether acquired by the said Henrietta T. Stewart prior to, or to be acquired by her after the passage of this act, nor shall the said Henrietta be entitled in any manner to have or claim any right, title or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed of the said James Stewart, whether acquired by the said James prior to, or to be acquired by him after the passage of this act.

CHAP. 294.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said Henrietta T. Stewart, shall not be liable for debts contracted by the said James Stewart, nor shall the said James Stewart be liable for any debts contracted by the said Henrietta after the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 294.

An act relating to Judgments and Decrees obtained in the several courts of this state.

Passed Mar. 13, 1832

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That upon any payment, either in part or in full, of any judgment or decree rendered in any of the county courts of this state, court of appeals or court of chancery, it shall be the duty of the plaintiff receiving such payment, his agent or attorney, to execute a receipt to the defendant for the amount thereof, on a short copy of said judgment or decree to be tendered to the plaintiff, his agent or attorney by the defendant, which shall be attested by some creditable witness, which said receipt may be filed in the office of the clerk or register, where such judgment or decree was rendered, and it shall thereupon be the duty of the said courts respectively, immediately to enter the said judgment or decree satisfied, if the said courts respectively shall be satisfied that the said receipt was executed as it may purport to be; *Provided*, That the said receipt purports to be in full, and should the said receipt purport to be in part payment only, said courts shall make a like entry for the amount specified in said receipt to have been paid; and in either case said courts shall note on the docket the date of said receipt, and also when left on file, and for every such entry the clerk or register of said courts, as the case may be, shall be entitled to receive ten cents at the time of making the same.
