CHAPTER 105.

An act to divorce Abraham Reeve, of Frederick county, from his wife, Catharine Reeve. Passed Mar. 12, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorce
That Abraham Reeve, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife, Catherine Reeve, and the marriage heretofore had and solemnised between them, is hereby declared to be null and void, and the said parties are hereby divorced, *a vinculo matrimonii*.

CHAPTER 106.

An act to divorce Sarah Satterfield, of Caroline county, from her husband James Satterfield. Passed Mar. 10, 1836

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Divorce
That Sarah Satterfield, of Caroline county, be henceforth divorced from her husband, James Satterfield, and the marriage heretofore had and solemnized between them is declared to be henceforth and forever null and void, and they are hereby declared to be mutually released from all and every duty and obligation, benefit and advantage growing out and in consequence of the said marriage, and the said Sarah Satterfield is hereby declared to be divorced, *a vinculo matrimonii*.

CHAPTER 107.

A supplement to the act establishing the Baltimore City Guards. Passed Mar. 7, 1836

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That before any officer of the Baltimore
