## CHAPTER 51.

*An act to divorce Susan Stewart, of Charles county, from her husband, John W. Stewart.* Passed Feb. 6, 1836

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Susan Stewart, of Charles county, be and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual co-habitation with her husband, John W. Stewart.* Divorcee

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted, That the said John W. Stewart shall not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said Susan Stewart, nor be entitled to any property or estate which she may hereafter acquire, nor shall she be entitled to any property which he may hereafter acquire.* Liabilities annulled
